One Mission: Created by the Mississippi State
Legislature in 2012, the Office of Mississippi Physician
Workforce (OMPW) develops strategies that attract,
educate, and sustain a well-trained and appropriately
distributed physician workforce in Mississippi, so as to
ensure health care access for all Mississippians.



Each office-based physician supports a per-capital economic output of \$3.1 million and supports an average of 17 jobs while paying \$1.4 million in wages and benefits.
